After the meal the clinic continued with Joe Sherer discussing how to put what everyone had learned to work... the short answer is PRACTICE, PRACTICE, PRACTICE.

Joe then introduced us to a couple of practice devices that we could use to help us improve our casting accuracy. One was a simple hula-hoop hung a few feet above the ground and the other was a home-made device made of PVC with various sized squares allowing you to cast at different sized targets.

The featured event of the afternoon session was the casting contest. Anyone interested in participating was welcome to test their new found casting skills.

Joe set up the practice devices at a distance of 40 feet for the event. The first round required participants to cast their flyline through four squares on the PVC device. Those who succeeded in the first round could then try to cast their flyline through the hula-hoop set up at a distance of 50 feet. Each person in the final round was given 10 attempts to make a successful cast through the hula-

hoop. The person successfully completing the cast in the fewest attempts was the winner.

After many skillful attempts by the contestants we had a winner successfully completing the task in 8 attempts. The winner was **Al Keller.** For his demonstration of casting prowess, Al was awarded a 6 wt TFO flyrod that was donated by and presented by Bob Clouser.

Everyone in attendance had a great time and we certainly hope to have a similar event next year, so if you missed this one make sure to mark your calenders for the next one.

to each student's abilities and needs. Consequently, anglers of all skill levels will benefit from this intensive curriculum.




