## September Program

Captain Leiza Fitzgerald grew up in Key West and in the woods of Moss Bluff, Florida. Her passion for fishing, hunting and conservation she learned from her parents. Leiza has combined these passions with work in the outdoor industry for nearly 30 years. She is a retired charter fishing guide, turkey hunting guide, prize winning competitive redfish, kingfish & tarpon tournament angler, television, radio and pod cast show co-host, "Top Gun" fishing instructor, fishing coach as well as author of national and local magazine and newspaper fishing and hunting articles.

Captain Leiza was named by Salt Strong as one of the top 12 lady anglers in Florida and Wildlife Enthusiast Magazine named her one of North America's 30 most influential women in fishing (top 5 in Saltwater) in 2019. In 2022, she was inducted into the Florida Sports Hall of Fame as the first angler athlete in their history. In August of 2025 Capt Leiza was honored as the first recipient of the Pamela Martin-Wells "Outdoor Woman of the Year" awarded The Legends of the Outdoors Hall of Fame/ Bass Pro Shops Cabela's.

From breaking barriers in competitive fishing to inspiring the next generation of anglers and conservationists, Leiza's career has been nothing short of legendary. As the driving force behind the CCA Florida STAR competition, she has helped award over \$1 million in youth scholarships and engage nearly 7,000 anglers annually through the catch-photo-release competition.

Affectionately known as "The Queen of Conservation" Leiza travels the country promoting the conservation of our marine resources, releasing redfish and educating the general public on how to catch fish and be good stewards of Florida's marine resources. Even with this busy career she still has a little time to spend with her sons fishing lakes & streams and hunting whitetail, turkey and elk with her bow.

#### Date and time selected based on

- 1) Weather
- What species are active and available
- 3) Trips may be planned with only 1 day notice

#### Trip participants' selection

- 1) Must be a current member of FFFA (with dues paid)
- Must have filled out sign up sheet for Pop up fishing trips
- You must respond to trip notification within 1 hour of first notification. If you don't respond the spot on the trip will be offered to the next person on the list (notifications will be by TEXT Msg)
- 4) When a Boat Captain and fisherman have been paired up it is their responsibility to communicate and set up a time and place to meet, and launch.
- 5) The number of spots open for the trip will be based on the number of boats available. (If you want to participate by kayak let us know by indicating in the BOAT line on the sign up sheet that you are open to fish by kayak if there are no openings on a boat.

The purpose of the POP UP fishing trip

- 2) Education & Learning by pairing more experienced Fly Fishers with less experienced.
